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

HOW TO ORDER.

ORDER by NAME and NUMBER. NEVER cut the Book. When you order from any other book, be sure to mention what book it is.

When Quads and Spaces are wanted for Display Founts, make an order for them, as they are sold separately.

When giving measure for Leads, Slugs or Rule, by ems, Pica ems are always understood, unless otherwise specified.

Write orders on separate sheet from letters. Put each item on a line by itself.

Always state how you wish goods shipped, whether by boat, rail or express.

When shipping old type to us, mark your own name on every package.

When ordering Chases, send diagram with correct inside and outside measures marked.

When writing for information, tell us what you want us to do, rather than ask us what we can do. Knowing your wants, we aim to supply them. To ask us what we can do is to set us to guessing what you want.

TERMS.

Parties who are established in business, doing well, and have a good reputation for promptness in paying their bills, can have as good accommodation here as at any other house. Such persons are entitled to the usual 60 days on our books. When extension is desired, it will be necessary to notify us before the expiration of the time, and specify the time asked for. On such extensions interest will be charged at the rate of 1 per cent. per month: and if more than two months is allowed, the account must be closed by note.

No accounts will be opened with those we are not acquainted with. Parties desiring credit must furnish unquestionably good reference, noar at hand.

For prompt payment within 30 days from date of purchase, we allow a discount of 10 per cent. from list. On machinery 5 per cent. For spot cash 2 per cent. additional discount is given.

Wood type, Zylotype News Plates, and a few minor articles are net.

PRICES.

Particular attention is directed to the fact that the prices given are, without any exception, Eastern List Prices, and are therefore, is some instances, from 10 to 15 per cent, lower than the quotations of other houses, who advance prices "to cover freight." Compare them and see for yourselves.

Prices of job founts are changed in many cases owing to the adoption of Point System and New Schemes. Don't imagine that the number of A's in a fount determines the price of a fount; prices are not arbitrary, but are arrived at by weight.







The staples are strung on wooden rods, and easily inserted in the machine.








NO. 1. PLAN OF YANKEE JOB CASE.




NO. 2. YANKEE JOB CASE.

The projecting form of lower case support affords a comfortable place to sit or stand, with no cases rubbing against the knees, and insures freedom from interruption of fellow workmen who may want to "set a line." line.

Each stand will accommodate two pairs of news cases, fifteen full size job cases and six news gallieys. On the deck on top, back of the brackets, there is also a large space, which may be utilized for sort drawers

a large space, which may be utilized for sort drawers or more galleys.

Not only is this the best stand to buy, on the score of convenience, but likewise that of economy. A common news stand, with only six or eight case slides below, costs \$6.50, and a galley rack holding ten galleys \$8.50—a total of \$15. These machines are made in a very thorough manner. The upper knife is curved, and is made of the best steel, while the frame is of iron, and the table of hard wood, which is the best surface for moving paper over easily. The front gauge is positive, easily set, and accurate, being controlled by a rack and pinion, which holds the gage exactly par-allel with the knife. It has reversible iron back gauge, extending 28 inches from the knife, and a side gauge, which may be placed in three different positions on

the table, according to the size of work being cut.

No clamp is required with this cutter, as it has a drawing cut, which keeps the sheets straight.





Being used in hollow squares, it will fill from four to six times as much space as the same weight of metal furniture. It can be put together in one-quarter to one-sixth the time. It makes a light and accurate form; a square and accurate lock-up. It helps to secure accurate register.




THE DEARING ALL-BRASS GALLEY.

Made entirely from hard-rolled brass without annealing. It is light, solid and strong; made without screws or rivets: It is practically one piece of solid brass. Cannot be injured by lye, steam or water. As the bottom bends over and forms an immovable brace for the sides, it will readily be seen how firm and rigid the whole becomes.



END VIEW OF THE DEARING ALL-BRASS GALLEY.

The bottom of this galley is made of extra-hard rolled brass, of the finest quality, and the sides and end braces are formed from the same piece as the bottom. The sides or upright facing strips are formed of minion rule brass, held rigidly in place by the brace formed from the bottom.

PATENT SEAMLESS GALLEY.

These galleys are made of one piece of metal, doing away with screws, hence having nothing in their construction which can rust and eventually weaken them. In ordinary galleys formed of one piece of metal, with the sides bent up at a sharp angle, the corner so formed is always the weakest part of the galley, and its strength is still further dimished by the necessary cutting away of the metal to form a sharp corner for the type to rest on. In our galley this defect is overcome. The metal bent up to form the sides of the galley extends around the end or head, to which it is firmly soldered, making a strong and stiff corner. We have also devised for use with this galley a very convenient and effective end lock, which can be instantly clamped to the side of the galley in any position.

1-Point

POINT, This is the unit of all measurement in the Aliquot System of Bodies. It is exactly one-seventy-second of an inch, and one-twelfth of Pica.

11/4-Point

GERMAN. This body is 1/8 of a Pica, and 1/2 of Nonpareil. It is familiarly known as "Eight-to-Pica."

2-Point

Saxon is $\frac{1}{6}$ of Pica, and $\frac{1}{2}$ of Nonpareil. It is the most useful of the lead and rule bodies. Four Saxons make one Brevier; five a Long Primer; six a Pica.

21.-Point

Norse is 1/4 of Long Primer.

8-Point

Brilliant is 1/4 of Pica, and 1/2 of Nonpareil.

81/4-Point

RUBY is 1/2 of Minion, and 1/4 of English.

4-Point

EXCELSIOR is 1/4 of Brevier and 1/4 of Pica.

4%-Point

DIAMOND is 34 of Bourgeois, and 34 of Great Primer.

5-Point

PEARL is % of Long Primer, and % of Paragon.

5%-Point

AGATE is 1/2 of Small Pica.

6-Point

Nonpareil is % of Pica, and % of Great Primer. It is exactly one-twelfth of an inch.

7-Point

MINION is 1/2 of English.

8-Point

Brevier is 3/2 of Columbian, and 3/3 of Pica.

9-Point

Bourgeois is $\frac{1}{2}$ of Great Primer, and $\frac{2}{3}$ of Pica. It is exactly $\frac{1}{8}$ of an inch.

10-Point

LONG PRIMER is 1/2 of Paragon.

11-Point

SMALL PICA is 1/2 of Double-Small Pica.

12-Point

PICA is exactly ¹₆ of an inch. This body is the printer's standard for measurement.

14-Point

ENGLISH is 2-lines Minion; a Nonpareil and a Brevier. Pica and a Saxon lead justify with it.

16-Point

COLUMBIAN is 2-lines Brevier; a Nonpareil and a Long Prim-

18-Point



GREAT PRIMER is 3-lines Nonpareil; 2-lines Bourgeois; a Brevier and a Long Primer, etc. A Great Primer 3-em space is the same as a Nonpareil 3-em quad. 18-Point is exactly ½ of an inch.

20-Point



PARAGON is 2-lines Long Primer; a Brevier and a Pica; Non-pareil and English; etc.

22-Point



DOUBLE SMALL PICA is 2-lines Small Pica; a Long Primer and a Pica: etc.

24-Point



Double Pica is 2-lines Pica; 3-lines Brevier; etc. It is ½ of an inch

Each size is a factor, and justification of one body with another is therefore certain and simple. The Table of Sizes shows this fractional system so perfectly that it is not thought necessary to carry the sizes any higher than 24-Point, for further illustration. It is easy enough to understand that 28-Point is Double English, 30-Point is 5-line Nonpareil, 32-Point is Double Columbian, 36-Point is Double Great Primer, 40-Point is Double Paragon, 42-Point is 7-line Nonpareil, etc.

Fractional type bodies were first introduced into France, by M. Didot. The graduation was made by tenths, their 10-Point body, Corpus, being the standard. The French bodies, however, not agreeing with the American inch, Mr. N. C. Hawks, of San Francisco, proposed the above plan (of graduation by twelfths, from a Pica that should gauge exactly $\frac{1}{10}$ of an inch,) to his firm, who adopted it in 1876. Other foundries followed, one by one, until nearly all are in harmony with this Aliquot System.

THE successful printer can attribute much of his fame to the persistency with which he endeavors to cater to the tastes and peculiarities of his patrons. To faithfully conform to the eccentricities of a certain class of people is no small task, and requires the exercise of that very essential requisite—patience—a virtue which every printer, if he wishes to occupy an advanced position in the calling, must cultivate. Our first statement, however, needs a little mending; yet the modification does not alter the fact. To make the matter plain, we will cite an example. An impecunious individual is obliged to seek the services of the printer. He wishes 5,000 bills printed, has but little means, and naturally desires the cheapest quality of work. Anything that sets forth his ideas, no matter how badly the rules of good taste are outraged, or how inferior the work, answers his requirements, or at least that is the view he entertains. In this case it would not be policy to strictly adhere to the wishes of a patron, and allow such damaging evidences of a printer's skill (?) to be circulated. Printers early learn the inevitable consequence of inferior workmanship, and only in exceptional cases do they quote prices that are inconsistent with creditable production, and in tose cases they are governed more by the financial status of their patrons than by any desire to profit by a poor grade of work. The productions of this character are almost invariably traceable to the amateur, who, having no adequate conception of his calling, builds up a fictitious standard and glories in the result of his unskilled efforts. Thus it is that this one class of labor has an existence; it is stimulated and supported by those short-sighted people who believe that

LABOR-SAVING TINT BLOCKS.—In general work of this class special color blocks have to be provided for each job, which are useless for any other purpose. Besides this it is usually considered necessary in such jobs to work the tints before the black, and this involves a great deal of preliminary work, as the black and color forms must be made to register exactly before the press can be started on the first color form. By using labor-saving tint blocks the expense is greatly reduced, as the same pieces can be used over and over again for different jobs, and, if ordinary care is exercised, the black form can be worked off at once, and the trouble of getting exact register is reduced to a minimum. In displaying a job to be worked in colors in this manner put the prominent lines in panels of brass rule or border, taking care to have the enclosing rules an equal number

THE United Typothetæ of America held its second annual meeting in New, York on the 18th of September. From the address of the President, Theodore De Vinne, we make the following excerpt: This organization came not too. soon. Other crafts had long ago proved the advantage of a national association. All the important trades we deal with are organized. There are societies of stationers, paper-makers, paper-rulers, and type-founders. The compositors of our offices have been organized for nearly forty years. But that was not enough. There are societies of pressmen and electrotypers, as well as press feeders. We are told by these societies that they are banded together for our good as well as for their own. I will not challenge that assurance, but I may

OCCASIONALLY, when it is rendered necessary for engraving purposes to run a type-metal plate in a plaster-ofparis mold, the metal comes out punctured with numerous air and steam holes, not at all like the smooth surface of the plaster in which it has been cast, These undesirable results are caused by the molten metal bubbling like boiling water as soon as it touches the mold, then cooling and hardening full of cavities on the underside where it is intended for engraving. So very objectionable a result can be readily obviated by a few simple precautions. Warm the plaster mold, then fasten it face upward in a shallow cast-iron pan, plunge pan and all into a pot of typemetal, and keep it immersed until the air and steam are no longer given off. Then draw it out, permit it to cool, and separate the plate, and it will be found free from cavities and ready for planing and trimming.
