White Lead Manufactory, corner of Front and Western Row, owned by B. McLeonard & Co., and driven by steam power; manufactures annually \$7,000 worth of white lead.

Stcam Saw Mill, on Front street, between Plumb and Western Row, owned by Scowden & Hughes. There is attached to this establishment a machine for cutting laths.

Iron Foundry, on Water, between Western Row and John streets, owned by Jabez Reynolds, is worked by steam power, and has a cupola and air furnace.

Engine Factory, owned by Jesse Smith, on Front, between John and Smith streets, employs 10 hands. The works are driven by steam power.

Cincinnati Steam Paper Mill, on Front below Mill street, owned by Phillips &. Speer, employs 35 hands.

Steam Saw Mill, near Mill creek bridge, runs 1 saw, and is owned by John Brown.

Steam and Fire Engine Factory, on Fifth between Elm and Plumb streets, owned by Chase and Seymour, employs 10 hands. Fire engines of the most elegant and durable workmanship, are manufactured at this establishment. For power and beauty they have, upon trial and comparison, been found fully equal, and in some cases, superior, to those made by the best artists in Philadelphia. The works are propelled by steam.

Cincinnati Type Foundry, on the corner of Vine and Centre street, manufactures every variety of type, printing presses, and the different articles connected with the printing business. There are in this establishment 11 machines for casting type. It gives employment to 60 hands, is worked by steam power, and manufactures annually to the amount of \$40,000. The company owning this establishment has been incorporated by the Legislature.

Patent Lever Lock Factory, situated on Vine, between Second and Third streets, owned by Shawk & Fitz, employs 10 hands, and manufactures all kinds of locks, brass butts, and folding door bolts, on the most approved models.

Steel, Saw and File Factory, on Plumb street near the Corporation Line, owned by Middleton, Garrard & Co., manufactures all kinds of cast steel, by steam power. Attached to this establishment is a Saw and File Factory, in which these articles are made equal in quality to those imported.

Phanix Manufacturing Company, corner of Ludlow and Second streets, William Tift, agent; is worked by steam, makes and finishes all kinds of steam engines. It also embraces cotton spinning, and runs about 500 spindles. In the entire factory about 35 hands are employed.

Printing Press Manufactory, owned by Samuel S. Dickinson, corner of Eighth and Elm streets, makes all kinds of printing pressess.

Kendall & Bassett, Ninth, between Main and Sycamore streets, Saddle Tree Manufacturers. Machinery driven by steam power.

Eagle Foundry, owned by J. Webb & M. Greenwood, Canal between Main and Walnut streets. Has a cupola furnace and is worked by steam.

Cincinnati Iron Foundry, on Maio, between Woodward and Franklin streets, owned by Niles & Hanks, has an air furnace and cupola, and employs 15 hands; works by steam power.
